

Full-time, Tenure-track, Assistant Professor in Comparative Politics

Mills College invites applications and nominations for a full-time, tenure-track assistant professorship in comparative politics in the Department of Government, to begin August, 2010. Candidates should have research interest in the politics of economic transformation and development, and in the dynamics of governance and state-building. Primary expertise may be in East Asia, Latin America or sub-Saharan Africa, with a strong preference for work that is cross-regional in nature. Quantitative research skills are desirable.

Only candidates holding the PhD degree will be considered. Applications should include a current CV, a statement of research and teaching interests, evidence of teaching experience, and three letters of recommendation.
