Information Literacy/Information Technology Skills Demonstrated skills to evaluate the authenticity, validity, and reliability of information.	Course must be completed at Mills
Interdisciplinary Perspectives	Students entering before the Junior year must take Mills College 060. Students entering with Junior standing will be exempt from this requirement, with the recommendation to take a Mills interdisciplinary course if there is none shown on the transcript.
